Evaluation Criteria for Awarding the International Pangai-Noon Budo Kai Hino Ryu Scholarship

We seek to award scholarships to association members who are pursuing excellence in their martial arts training AND in other areas of life, such as academics and character. **You must be a member of the International Pangai-Noon Budo Kai Hino Ryu Association in order to be considered for this scholarship.** The scholarship will be awarded in the form of a savings bond, and will be based upon the following weighted criteria, in order of the greater weight to the lesser weight:

- association membership
- martial arts training pursued
- events attended and awards earned
- leadership
- contribution to your art
- academic performance
- activities and interests

As for your submission itself, we are also looking at your overall presentation. In this regard, we review and evaluate:

- Your spelling
- Your grammar
- Your vigor of expression and your passion for your topic
- Your neatness

1. Criteria: The following points are intended to help you understand what kind of information should be included on your application. (NOTE: The following are NOT listed in order of importance or weight for evaluation.)

- a. Martial Arts Training:** Special attention will be given to those who demonstrate that they are expanding the breadth of their martial arts knowledge while also growing in the depth of their knowledge of their primary art.
 - (1)** In the **summary section**, list your primary art, as well as other arts you have studied. Include the instructor you studied under, the dates you trained with him/her, and the highest rank you achieved.
 - (2)** In your **martial arts log book**, record any seminars or tournaments in which you participate. If you place at a tournament, record the place and the event. Both seminars and tournaments must be certified by the signature of your instructor or the tournament director on the date of the event. Also record your classes and any other events.
 - (3) Other martial arts honors** would include a state or national ranking, student of the year, etc. These honors must be verified by attached documentation.

- b. Academic Achievement/Performance:** Submit your standardized test scores from the SAT, ACT, or **other standardized test or other measures of your academic performance**. We are particularly interested in your overall academic performance, however best measured, and as it applies to the latest completed year of school.
- c. Leadership and contribution to your art:** List extracurricular activities that demonstrate your character and leadership. In other words, it is not the number of activities that is important, but the balance, depth, and significance of those activities. For references, you may include up to three letters that confirm your involvement in the activities you've listed (as well as martial arts activities). These letters should explain your specific contributions and specific demonstrations of character.
- d. Personal essay:** Submit a personal essay with at most 2 pages single-spaced 12-point type (may be less). Your essay should explain something about what your goals are, what your martial arts training means to you, why you want to go to college, etc.

2. Other requirements: Remember to include a personal photo and to sign and submit the **Assignment of Rights and Consent to Publish Scholarship Information form** included with the application. By signing this form, you give us the right to publish your photograph and basic information regarding your past accomplishments and future plans in the event you are a scholarship winner or we chose to use some of your additional photographs.

MARTIAL ARTS LOG BOOK

Instructions

1. Print out 12 copies of the page 8, the monthly log page (one for each month of the year of your application period), and put the copies into a folder or notebook. The left margin is wider to allow you to punch holes for a notebook.
2. Begin your log with November of the *year before* the application deadline; the last month will be October of the year of application.
3. Have your instructor certify your attendance in class by signing the appropriate box.
4. Attendance at seminars may be certified by signature of the seminar instructor or an attending instructor from your school.
5. Participation in tournaments means *competing* in one or more events. Participation may be certified by signature of the tournament director or an attending instructor from your school.
6. Tournament wins must be accompanied by proof of your placement, such as a completed tournament card showing the event and place. (Keep these in an envelope to be turned in with the scholarship application.)
7. All signatures must be obtained at the time of the event.
